Get ahead of somebody	Superare qualcuno	I'm not interested in winning. It's enough for me to get ahead of James.	Outdo; Overcome
Get after	Inseguire	Never stop getting after your dreams	Chase
Get along	Andare d'accordo, intendersi bene	Jo and I get along well.	Have a good relationship
Get around	Andare in giro	In the summer I like to get around Europe.	Move, travel
Get at	Rimproverare, criticare senza ragione	Teachers should not get at children.	Criticize
Get away	Scappare, andarsene	The thief got away in a stolen car.	Escape, leave a place
Get back	Riavere indietro	I never got back the book I lent to Tom.	Return
Get back to	Tornare in un luogo	I don't want to get back to school!	Return

Get in	Arrivare	Kate always gets in late to school	Arrive
Get in /Into	Entrare, essere ammesso/a	My brother got into the best art school in the country.	To be accepted
Get it over with	Finire una cosa che non si ha voglia di fare	Get your homework over with and then go and play.	Finish
Get off	Scendere da un aereo, treno, bus	When you get off the plane, text me.	Leave a bus, plane, or train
Get on	Salire su un mezzo di trasporto	Don't get on the train without a ticket.	Board
Get on	Andare d'accordo	We work together, we have to get on.	Get along
Get out	Uscire da un luogo (anche da una macchina); uscire (per divertirsi)	Pull over, I want to get out.	Leave
Get over with	Completare (una attività sgradevole)	Get over with your homework.	Complete
Get through	Arrivare fino alla fine	It was so impossible to get through that film: too boring.	Finish
Get together	Incontrarsi	Let's get together tomorrow at five.	Meet
Get up	Alzarsi	I get up every morning at 7:30 a.m.	Leave the bed after you wake up
